Cute as buttons in their brand new school uniforms, the little ones' first-day nerves quickly gave way to smiles and giggles as they played games and took part in fun activities with their new classmates.

One of those excited tots was Emma Bohlscheid. Her parents Elise and Matthew enrolled Emma at the school's early learning centre, and are very happy they did. 'Emma couldn't wait to start at the school,' says Elise. 'When we dropped her off, she sat down and started drawing right away. She was very relaxed and happy to be there from the get go.'

The Bohlscheids love the fact the school is so close. 'It's so easy to drop her off and pick her up. And as she gets older, she'll be able to walk herself to school and home again, so it's perfect.'

The Anglican School Googong currently has classes from Early Learning to Year 2, but classes on offer will grow with the township. Primary classes will be added to each year with the first



Year 7 group kicking off in 2018, and the first Year 12 class will graduate in 2023.

'We're just so happy that Emma will be able to complete her entire education here in Googong. It gives her stability, and means she can settle in and make friends for the long term,' says Matthew. 'We're already planning on sending our 10-month-old son William there in a few years time.

The Early Learning Centre offers plenty of fun learning activities for the kids – Emma is learning and playing the whole time she's there. Her favourites? 'She really enjoys music and art, and loves heading outside to play in the sandpit, says Mum.

It's a modern school, too, with interactive computer panels in classrooms, tablet computers and online access to resources for students and parents, and flexible learning spaces throughout the school, including outdoor learning areas.

Eventually, Googong will be home to two secondary and two primary schools.

Construction Update

Number of homes under construction: 175 Work on the township's Water Recycling Plant is underway. It should be treating wastewater from Googong's homes by September, which means Googong will be greener in both senses of the word.

Beltana Park's gardens, grass and trees are doing well thanks to our irrigation system and the hard work of our maintenance team.

Rockley Oval is now open and recently saw its first event – an informal cricket match between local residents. The oval was also used by the Queanbeyan Tigers Junior AFL club for their registration day where stars from the GWS Giants came to support the Tigers. In Winter, Rockley Oval will be the home ground of the Junior Tigers and the Harman Hogs.

The next major park and playground – John Caragh Park – is set to open in April. The park's main feature is an extensive path system that winds throughout, as well as BBQ facilities and a 'bird's nest' swing.

Preliminary planning for Googong North Village Centre is underway. Plans should be confirmed within the next few months.

Designs for an upgrade to the intersection of Googong Road with Old Cooma Road –

that's the township's main entrance – have been approved, and work has already begun.
